THE SKINNERS' CHARITY FOUNDATION

Small grants The Skinners' Charity Foundation are looking to fund Arts, Heritage, and Community projects primarily (but not exclusively) in London and Kent.

Projects can range from one-off events through to multi-year projects. Grants of up to £2,000 per-year are available for projects and/or capital items, with awards for three years open to consideration.

Arts and Heritage projects can include; local heritage projects which help local groups to conserve and restore their landmarks, landscape, traditions and culture. Examples of Performing and Visual Arts work are those involved in performances, art, music, and drama activities. Community projects cover work that support their area, bringing together and supporting local people.

Applying organisations should have an annual turnover below £200,000.

SMALL GRANTS FOR CAPITAL EXPENDITURE

PERCY BILTON CHARITY

The Percy Bilton Charity offers one-off grants of up to £5,000 for furnishings and equipment (excluding office items), building or refurbishment projects.

The charity's target audience is other charities assisting Disadvantaged/underprivileged young people (under 25 years of age) People with disabilities (physical or learning disabilities) or mental health problems older people (aged over 60) Applications are accepted on a rolling basis.

GRANTS FOR CAPITAL PROJECTS

BERNARD SUNLEY FOUNDATION

The Bernard Sunley Foundation is a family grant-making foundation which supports charities working to raise the quality of life and provide greater opportunities for the young, the elderly, the disabled and the disadvantaged.

Each year the foundation gives about £4 million to capital projects that deliver a real community focus or provide facilities to support those in need.

Typical funding might be for new buildings, extensions, refurbishments and recreational spaces, or for new minibuses and other vehicles that provide a vital service to those most in need in their local community.

Applications are accepted on a rolling basis.
