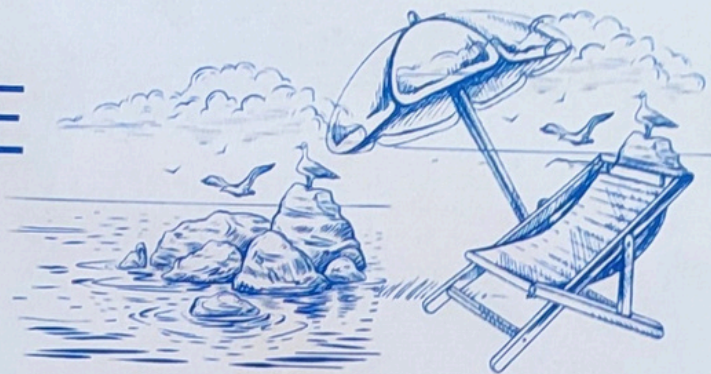

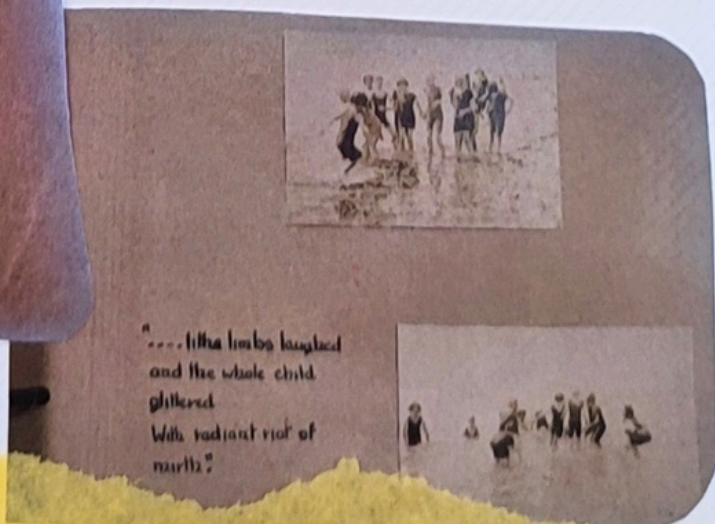
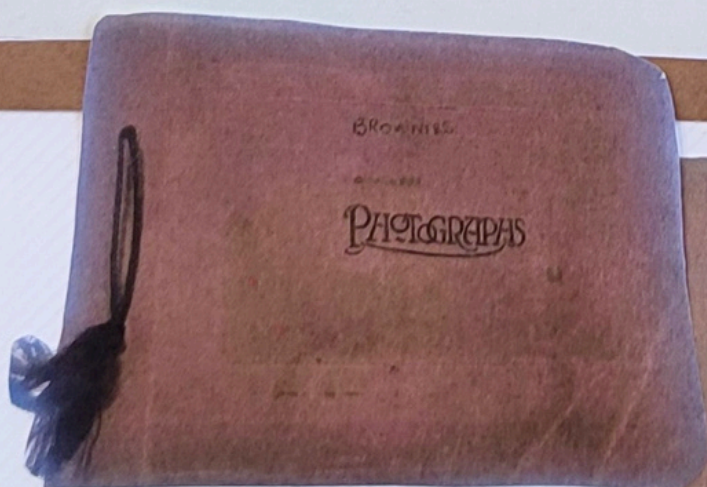
WHY WE MADE THIS **SCRAPBOOK**



This scrapbook was created as part of New Voices for Old Stories, Aston-Mansfield's youth-led heritage programme.

Nearly a hundred years ago, the Canning Town Women's Settlement ran retreats for women and children, offering rest and community at homes in Pagham and Danbury. Inspired by a scrapbook kept by the Brownies of Pagham, we wanted to recreate that spirit of escape and empowerment.

Our trip to the seaside gave us space to rest, reflect, and share stories across generations. Just like the Brownies before us, we chose to document the experience in a scrapbook – a place to gather photos, conversations, drawings, and advice that capture what womanhood and community mean today.
